



- Why financial reporting is important and to whom

Farm Management Canada had the distinct pleasure of hosting an interactive workshop during the CAPI Exchange event in Ottawa. The workshop, titled Proactive Solutions for Managing Farm Risk, led participants through interactive activities including a case study to explore the state of farm risk management and the practices and tools that can help producers build resilience and protect their operations. 


